CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

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Child Advocacy Centers - Expansion

FOR the purpose of requiring the Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention to ensure, to the greatest extent practicable, that every child in the State has access to a child advocacy center; requiring child advocacy centers to assist in the response to or investigation of certain offenses against children; authorizing child advocacy centers to assist in the response to or investigation of certain offenses against children; requiring child advocacy centers to provide a certain level of care; requiring the Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention to contract with a certain organization that meets certain requirements to establish a Maryland Statewide Organization for Child Advocacy Centers; requiring the Maryland Statewide Organization for Child Advocacy Centers to establish certain standards for child advocacy centers; requiring money for child advocacy centers to be distributed in a certain manner by the Maryland Statewide Organization for Child Advocacy Centers and the Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention; authorizing requiring the Governor to include in the annual budget a certain appropriation beginning in a certain fiscal year; altering the date that the Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention is required to submit a certain annual report; adding child advocacy centers to the list of agencies that are required to enter into a certain written agreement that specifies standard operating procedures for certain child abuse and neglect investigations and prosecutions; making clarifying and technical changes; and generally relating to child advocacy centers.
