- 10 (6) A single promotional event:
- (i) may be held from 10 a.m. to 10 p.m. each day; and
- 12 (ii) may not exceed 3 consecutive days.
- 13 (7) The permit fee is \$25 per event.
- 14 (k) The annual license fee is \$200.

 1, 2019.
