## A BILL ENTITLED

Teachers' Pension System - Option Election

1 AN ACT concerning

FOR the purpose of allowing certain retirees of the Teachers' Pension System to elect a change in an optional form of allowance; specifying the manner in which an election to change a certain optional form of allowance shall be made; specifying the manner in which a retiree's allowance shall be calculated and paid under a change to an optional form of allowance made in accordance with this Act; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to electing an optional form of allowance from the Teachers' Pension System.

- 15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND.
- 16 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 19 (a) (1) Subject to paragraph (2) of this subsection, instead of the basic 20 allowance provided under the State system of a member, the member may elect a reduced 21 allowance to be paid as one of the options under § 21–403 of this subtitle.
- 22 (2) Paragraph (1) of this subsection applies to a member of:
- 23 (i) the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System or State Police 24 Retirement System only if, at retirement, the member does not have a spouse; and

- 1 (ii) the Judges' Retirement System only if, at retirement, the 2 member does not have a spouse or child under the age of 18 years. 3 To elect an optional form of allowance, a member shall: (b) 4 (1) complete the appropriate form that the Board of Trustees provides; and file the form with the Board of Trustees before the first allowance 5 (2)6 payment normally becomes due. 7 (c) A member who has elected an optional form of allowance may change the 8 election only if the member notifies the Board of Trustees before the first allowance 9 payment normally becomes due. If a member dies before the effective date of retirement, the Board of Trustees 10 11 shall pay the benefits payable on the member's behalf as if the member had not elected an 12optional form of allowance. 13 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That: 14 This section applies to an individual who: (a) 15 (1) was a member of the Teachers' Pension System; 16 was employed as a teacher with the Prince George's County public (2)school system on or after January 1, 1988; 17 18 ceased employment as a teacher with the Prince George's County public 19 school system on or after June 30, 2017; and 20 is a retiree of the Teachers' Pension System who elected "Option 1" 21under § 21-403(a) of the State Personnel and Pensions Article as an optional form of 22allowance in accordance with § 21–401 of the State Personnel and Pensions Article. 23 Notwithstanding § 21–401(c) of the State Personnel and Pensions (b) 24Article, an individual described under subsection (a) of this section may change the individual's election of an optional form of allowance. 2526 An election to change an optional form of allowance under paragraph (2)27 (1) of this subsection shall be:
- 29 (ii) submitted to the Board of Trustees for the State Retirement and 30 Pension System on a form provided by the Board of Trustees.

made on or before December 31, 2020; and

- 1 (c) A retiree's allowance under a change to an optional form of allowance made in accordance with subsection (b) of this section shall:
- 3 (1) be calculated as if the optional form of allowance was elected at the time 4 of retirement, and include any applicable cost—of—living adjustments that would have been 5 made to the allowance; and
- 6 (2) apply prospectively from the first distribution after the election to 7 change an optional form of allowance is submitted to the Board of Trustees.
- SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2020. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and, at the end of June 30, 2021, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
