10 11	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

14	(c) (1) There is an Oyster Advisory Commission in the Department.

17 18	(I) ONE MEMBER OF THE SENATE OF MARYLAND, APPOINTED BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE;
19 20	(II) ONE MEMBER OF THE MARYLAND HOUSE OF DELEGATES, APPOINTED BY THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE;

$\frac{3}{4}$	(IV) ONE MEMBER OF THE CHESAPEAKE BAY COMMERCIAL FISHERMEN'S ASSOCIATION, APPOINTED BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE ASSOCIATION;

17 18	(iii) Review the latest findings relevant to the Environmental Impact Statement evaluating oyster restoration alternatives for the Chesapeake Bay;
19 20	(iv) Review any other scientific, economic, or cultural information relevant to oysters in the Chesapeake Bay; and
21 22 23	(v) By December 31, 2007 and to the extent reasonably appropriate, report to the Governor and, in accordance with § $2-1246$ of the State Government Article, the General Assembly on:

26 27 28 29	2. The framework and effectiveness of the oyster sanctuary, harvest reserve, and repletion programs, and the overall management of natural oyster bars, after performing a cost-benefit analysis that considers biological, ecological, economic, and cultural issues;

32	4. Strategies to improve enforcement of closed oyster areas.
