3 FOR the purpose of requiring the Police Training Commission to require that certain 4 entrance-level and in-service police training conducted by the State and each county  $\mathbf{5}$ and municipal police training school include certain training relating to the criminal 6 laws concerning human trafficking and the appropriate treatment of victims of 7 human trafficking; authorizing certain training to be conducted in person or online; 8 and generally relating to police training requirements.
