Government Shutdowns - Employees - Protections

FOR the purpose of prohibiting a public service company from terminating electric or gas service to certain residential customers for nonpayment on certain days; authorizing the Public Service Commission to adopt certain regulations; requiring a certain court to stay certain proceedings for the foreclosure or repossession of certain residential property for a certain period of time under certain circumstances; defining a certain term; making this Act an emergency measure; and generally relating to protections for government employees subject to a government shutdown.

25 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND.

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Article – Public Utilities

- 3 (A) IN THIS SECTION, "ELIGIBLE RESIDENTIAL CUSTOMER" MEANS A 4 RESIDENTIAL ELECTRIC OR GAS CUSTOMER WHO IS:
- 5 (1) EMPLOYED BY THE FEDERAL OR STATE GOVERNMENT OR A LOCAL 6 GOVERNMENT IN THE STATE; AND
- 7 (2) FURLOUGHED FROM WORK BECAUSE OF A GOVERNMENT 8 SHUTDOWN, REGARDLESS OF WHETHER THE EMPLOYEE IS REQUIRED TO REPORT 9 TO WORK DURING THE FURLOUGH.

- 12 (a) Whenever the tenant or tenants fail to pay the rent when due and payable, it shall be lawful for the landlord to have again and repossess the premises.
- 14 (B-1) (1) THIS SUBSECTION APPLIES ONLY TO AN ACTION FOR THE 15 REPOSSESSION OF RESIDENTIAL PROPERTY.
- 16 (2) NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER LAW, THE COURT SHALL STAY
- 17 THE PROCEEDING IF THE TENANT OR AN OCCUPANT OF THE PROPERTY THAT IS THE

- 26 TO REPORT TO WORK DURING THE FURLOUGH.
- 27 (3) (I) SUBJECT TO SUBPARAGRAPH (II) OF THIS PARAGRAPH, A
- 28 STAY UNDER THIS SUBSECTION SHALL BE GRANTED FOR A TIME THAT THE COURT
- 29 CONSIDERS REASONABLE.
- 30 (II) A STAY UNDER THIS SUBSECTION MAY NOT BE GRANTED
- 31 FOR A PERIOD THAT ENDS MORE THAN 30 DAYS AFTER THE END OF THE
- 32 GOVERNMENT SHUTDOWN WITHOUT A SHOWING OF SUFFICIENT CAUSE BY A PARTY

1 TO THE ACTION.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three—fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is enacted.
