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## Human Services - Two Generation Family Economic Security Commission

- 3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Two Generation Family Economic Security 4 Commission in the Department of Human Services; providing for the composition, 5 chair, and staffing of the Commission; prohibiting a member of the Commission from 6 receiving certain compensation, but authorizing the reimbursement of certain 7 expenses; requiring the Commission to study, evaluate, and coordinate services and 8 programs to address multigenerational poverty; authorizing the Commission to use 9 certain funding to implement certain programs and to partner with local 10 jurisdictions and local action agencies to implement the programs; requiring the 11 Commission to submit an annual report of its studies and recommendations to the 12 Governor and the General Assembly; requiring units of executive agencies to 13 cooperate with the Commission; requiring the Governor to provide funding for the 14 Commission in the Department's annual budget; specifying the terms of certain 15 initial members of the Commission; defining a certain term; and generally relating 16 to the Two Generation Family Economic Security Commission.

- 1 (12) ONE COUNTY HEALTH OFFICER, APPOINTED BY THE SECRETARY
- 2 OF HEALTH IN CONSULTATION WITH THE MARYLAND ASSOCIATION OF COUNTY
- 3 HEALTH OFFICERS;
- 4 (13) ONE MEMBER APPOINTED BY THE MARYLAND ASSOCIATION OF
