A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Natural Resources - Fresh Oyster Shells - Purchase by County Oyster Committees

FOR the purpose of requiring the Department of Natural Resources to authorize
county oyster committees to purchase annually up to a certain number of
bushels of fresh oyster shells that have not gone through a hatchery for
production of spat on the fresh oyster shell for placement on a public oyster
fishery bottom; making this Act an emergency measure; and generally relating
to the purchase of fresh oyster shells.

- 16 WHEREAS, Fresh oyster shells are used as setting material for new spat to be 17 planted back into the Chesapeake Bay; and
- 18 WHEREAS, New oysters prefer to attach and grow onto other fresh oyster19 shells; and

WHEREAS, A healthy oyster reef filters the Chesapeake Bay's waters and provides habitat for an underwater community that furnishes life support for blue crabs and fish; and

EXPLANATION: CAPITALS INDICATE MATTER ADDED TO EXISTING LAW. [Brackets] indicate matter deleted from existing law.



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WHEREAS, There are not enough fresh oyster shells available to meet all of the
 State's needs; and

3 WHEREAS, The Department of Natural Resources' current policy for 4 purchasing fresh oyster shells allows counties to purchase the fresh oyster shell only if 5 the shell has gone through a hatchery for production of spat on the shell; and

6 WHEREAS, The University of Maryland Center for Environmental Science's 7 Horn Point Hatchery has an 80% to 90% mortality rate for the spat that is placed on 8 fresh oyster shells and planted back into the water; and

9 WHEREAS, The price of fresh oyster shells that have gone through the Horn 10 Point Hatchery is ten times more expensive than the price of fresh oyster shells that 11 have not gone through the Horn Point Hatchery; and

12 WHEREAS, There are only 60,000 bushels of fresh oyster shells available to the 13 industry for purchase; and

14 WHEREAS, Authorizing the purchase of fresh oyster shells that have not gone 15 through a hatchery for production of spat on the fresh oyster shell will assist with 16 oyster restoration in the Chesapeake Bay; now, therefore,

17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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Article – Natural Resources

20 **4–1019.3**.

THE DEPARTMENT SHALL AUTHORIZE COUNTY OYSTER COMMITTEES TO PURCHASE ANNUALLY UP TO 400,000 BUSHELS OF FRESH OYSTER SHELLS THAT HAVE NOT GONE THROUGH A HATCHERY FOR PRODUCTION OF SPAT ON THE FRESH OYSTER SHELL FOR PLACEMENT ON A PUBLIC OYSTER FISHERY BOTTOM.

25 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency 26 measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, 27 has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members 28 elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from 29 the date it is enacted.

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
