Public Safety - Fire Investigation Science Advisory Workgroup

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Fire Investigation Science Advisory Workgroup; 4 providing for the composition, chair, and staffing of the Workgroup; prohibiting a 5 member or an ex officio member of the Workgroup from receiving certain 6 compensation, but authorizing the reimbursement of certain expenses; requiring the 7 Workgroup to obtain certain information and recommendations, meet on a certain 8 schedule, and conduct reviews of certain fire and explosion investigations performed 9 by certain public agencies; requiring a certain agency to provide a certain investigative file to the Workgroup on request; requiring a certain fire marshal to 10 11 direct a certain investigator to attend a certain meeting of the Workgroup; requiring 12 the Workgroup to produce minutes of its meetings and report its findings and 13 recommendations to the State Fire Marshal and certain other persons under certain 14 circumstances; and generally relating to the Fire Investigation Science Advisory Workgroup. 15

- 21 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 22 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 23 Article Public Safety
- 24 **7–404.**

(A) THERE IS A FIRE INVESTIGATION SCIENCE ADVISORY WORKGROUP.

- 1 (B) THE CHAIR OF THE FIRE PROTECTION ENGINEERING DEPARTMENT AT 2 THE UNIVERSITY OF MARYLAND, COLLEGE PARK, OR THE CHAIR'S DESIGNEE, 3 SHALL CHAIR THE WORKGROUP.
- 4 (C) THE WORKGROUP CONSISTS OF UP TO 10 MEMBERS SELECTED BY THE 5 CHAIR IN CONSULTATION WITH THE FOLLOWING EX OFFICIO MEMBERS:
- 6 (1) THE STATE FIRE MARSHAL;
- 7 (2) EACH FIRE MARSHAL SERVING A COUNTY OR CITY JURISDICTION;
- 8 (3) A REPRESENTATIVE OF THE MARYLAND FIRE AND RESCUE 9 INSTITUTE (MFRI), DESIGNATED BY THE MFRI; AND
- 10 (4) A REPRESENTATIVE OF THE OFFICE OF THE ATTORNEY
 11 GENERAL, DESIGNATED BY THE ATTORNEY GENERAL.
- 12 (D) THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION SHALL PROVIDE STAFF FOR 13 THE WORKGROUP.
- 14 (E) A MEMBER OR AN EX OFFICIO MEMBER OF THE WORKGROUP:
- 15 (1) MAY NOT RECEIVE COMPENSATION AS A MEMBER OF THE 16 WORKGROUP; BUT
- 17 (2) IS ENTITLED TO REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXPENSES UNDER THE STANDARD STATE TRAVEL REGULATIONS, AS PROVIDED IN THE STATE BUDGET.
- 19 **(F)** THE WORKGROUP SHALL:
- 20 (1) ACCEPT RECOMMENDATIONS FROM PUBLIC FIRE AND EXPLOSION 21 INVESTIGATION AGENCIES AND THE STATE FIRE MARSHAL FOR INVESTIGATIONS 22 THAT WOULD BE APPROPRIATE FOR REVIEW BY THE WORKGROUP;
- 23 (2) SELECT INVESTIGATIONS TO BE REVIEWED BY THE WORKGROUP;
- 24 (3) OBTAIN FROM THE APPROPRIATE PUBLIC FIRE AND EXPLOSION 25 INVESTIGATION AGENCY IN THE STATE THE FULL INVESTIGATION FILE OF EACH
- 26 INVESTIGATION THAT IS SELECTED TO BE REVIEWED BY THE WORKGROUP;
- 27 (4) OBTAIN RELEVANT TRANSCRIPTS OF ALL TESTIMONY PROVIDED 28 BY EACH INVESTIGATOR, IN ANY COURT PROCEEDING HELD IN THE STATE,

- 1 REGARDING ANY FIRE OR EXPLOSION INVESTIGATION THAT IS SELECTED TO BE
- 2 REVIEWED BY THE WORKGROUP:
- 3 (5) MEET ON A QUARTERLY BASIS TO REVIEW THE SELECTED 4 INVESTIGATIONS;
- 5 (6) PRODUCE MINUTES OF EACH MEETING; AND
- 6 (7) PRODUCE AN ANNUAL SUMMARY REPORT ON THE WORKGROUP'S
 7 FINDINGS AND SUBMIT THE REPORT TO THE STATE FIRE MARSHAL AND THE OTHER
 8 EX OFFICIO MEMBERS OF THE WORKGROUP.
- 9 (G) A PUBLIC FIRE AND EXPLOSION INVESTIGATION AGENCY SHALL 10 PROVIDE TO THE WORKGROUP THE FULL INVESTIGATIVE FILE CONNECTED WITH ANY INVESTIGATION THAT IS REQUESTED BY THE WORKGROUP.
- 12 (H) THE STATE FIRE MARSHAL OR THE FIRE MARSHAL SERVING THE
 13 COUNTY OR CITY JURISDICTION OF A PUBLIC FIRE AND EXPLOSION INVESTIGATION
 14 AGENCY SHALL DIRECT THE INVESTIGATOR FROM EACH SELECTED INVESTIGATION
 15 TO ATTEND THE REVIEW OF THE INVESTIGATION BY THE WORKGROUP.
- (I) IF, IN A REVIEW OF A SELECTED INVESTIGATION THAT HAS BEEN USED IN A PROSECUTION OF A FIRE-RELATED CRIME, THE WORKGROUP IDENTIFIES SERIOUS TECHNICAL ISSUES WITH THE INVESTIGATION, THE WORKGROUP SHALL REPORT ITS FINDINGS IN WRITING TO THE PROSECUTOR OF THE CRIME, THE DEFENDANT OR THE DEFENDANT'S ATTORNEY, AND THE ATTORNEY GENERAL.
- 21 (J) THE WORKGROUP SHALL MAKE PERIODIC RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE 22 STATE FIRE MARSHAL AND THE MFRI FOR TRAINING ENHANCEMENTS BASED ON 23 FINDINGS FROM THE REVIEW OF SELECTED INVESTIGATIONS.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2018.
