- 4 FOR the purpose of repealing exceptions to the entertainment permit in Prince George's 5 County; establishing a family entertainment permit in the county; establishing 6 requirements that an alcoholic beverages license holder whose business provides 7 family entertainment must meet to obtain a family entertainment permit; requiring 8 the Board of License Commissioners to determine the days and hours the permit is 9 to be in effect, subject to a certain restriction; requiring the Board to adopt certain 10 regulations; establishing a certain fee for the permit; and generally relating to 11 entertainment permits in Prince George's County.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 1 2 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 3 Article - Alcoholic Beverages 26-102. 4 This title applies only in Prince George's County. 5 6 26-1103. 7 (a) This section does not apply to a license holder that seeks to provide 8 entertainment if: 9 the license of the license holder is issued under § 26–1003, § 26–1006, § 26–1008, § 26–1009, § 26–1010, § 26–1011, § 26–1014, § 26–1015, § 26–1016, or § 26–1018.1 10 of this title: OR 11 12 the Board determines that the license holder's principal business is to (2)provide family entertainment; 13 14 the license is a Class B (on-sale) license issued for a restaurant, and 15 the license holder provides entertainment for adults and children that: 16 (i) is ancillary to the operation of the business; and 17 is not the primary focus of marketing or promotion for the (ii) business; or 18 the license is a veterans or fraternal Class C license and the 19 [(4)] **(2)** license holder provides entertainment that: 20 21(i) is under the direct supervision of the license holder; 22is for adults, children, and families of the organization or the (ii) 23 public; and 24(iii) when offered, ends not later than midnight. THERE IS A FAMILY ENTERTAINMENT PERMIT.

- 1 (B) The Board may issue the permit to a holder of a Class B 2 (on–sale) license in accordance with this section if the Board
- 3 **DETERMINES THAT:**
- 4 (1) THE LICENSE HOLDER'S BUSINESS PROVIDES FAMILY 5 ENTERTAINMENT;
- 6 (2) THE ROOM IN WHICH THE ENTERTAINMENT IS TO BE PROVIDED 7 HAS A SEATING CAPACITY OF NOT MORE THAN 110 INDIVIDUALS;
- 8 (3) THE ESTABLISHMENT WILL ALLOW UNDERAGE PERSONS TO VIEW 9 THE ENTERTAINMENT AND WILL NOT OFFER ENTERTAINMENT FOR ADULTS ONLY;
- 10 (4) THE AVERAGE DAILY RECEIPTS FROM THE SALE OF FOOD WILL BE
 11 AT LEAST 60% OF THE TOTAL DAILY RECEIPTS FROM THE SALE OF FOOD AND DRINK
 12 IN THE ESTABLISHMENT;
- 13 (5) THE ESTABLISHMENT WILL OFFER THE SAME MENU, INCLUDING 14 APPETIZERS, MAIN COURSES, AND DESSERTS, THROUGHOUT THE ESTABLISHMENT 15 AND DURING THE TIME WHEN THE ENTERTAINMENT IS PROVIDED; AND
- 16 (6) THE PRICES FOR FOOD AND DRINK IN THE ROOM WHERE THE
 17 ENTERTAINMENT IS TO BE PROVIDED WILL NOT VARY FROM THE PRICES FOR FOOD
 18 AND DRINK OFFERED ELSEWHERE IN THE ESTABLISHMENT.
- 19 (C) (1) SUBJECT TO PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION, THE PERMIT 20 AUTHORIZES THE PERMIT HOLDER TO IMPOSE A COVER CHARGE AND PROVIDE 21 ENTERTAINMENT.
- 22 (2) THE PERMIT HOLDER SHALL COMPLY WITH ALL REQUIREMENTS
 23 UNDER COUNTY LAW, INCLUDING ZONING AND USE AND OCCUPANCY LAWS.
- 24 (D) (1) THE BOARD SHALL DETERMINE:
- 25 (I) THE NUMBER OF DAYS IN A WEEK THAT A PERMIT HOLDER 26 MAY EXERCISE THE PRIVILEGES OF THE PERMIT; AND
- 27 (II) SUBJECT TO PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION, THE 28 HOURS THAT THE PERMIT MAY BE IN EFFECT.
- 29 (2) ENTERTAINMENT MAY NOT BE PROVIDED LATER THAN MIDNIGHT.

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- 1 (E) THE HOLDER OF THE PERMIT SHALL BE SUBJECT TO § 26–1103(E) 2 THROUGH (H)(1) AND (H)(3) THROUGH (L) OF THIS SUBTITLE.
- 3 (F) THE BOARD SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS TO CARRY OUT THIS SECTION.
- 4 (G) THE ANNUAL FEE FOR THE PERMIT IS \$250, WHICH IS IN ADDITION TO 5 THE ANNUAL FEE FOR THE CLASS B LICENSE.
- $\,\,$ SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July $7-1,\,2019.$
