A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

County Boards of Education - Spending - Reporting Requirement

- FOR the purpose of requiring each county board of education to provide a report to the State Department of Education by certain dates on the amount of State, local, and federal funds spent per student for certain students at each school; requiring the Department to submit a certain report to the General Assembly by certain dates; stating the intent of the General Assembly; and generally relating to the amount of per student spending by each county board.

- 14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 16 Article Education
- 17 **5–119.**
- 18 (A) BY OCTOBER 1, 2015, AND EVERY 3 YEARS THEREAFTER, EACH COUNTY BOARD SHALL SUBMIT A FUNDING REPORT TO THE DEPARTMENT THAT INCLUDES THE STATE, LOCAL, AND FEDERAL PER STUDENT SPENDING FOR:
- 21 (1) STUDENTS QUALIFIED FOR COMPENSATORY EDUCATION 22 FUNDING UNDER § 5–207 OF THIS TITLE;

- 3 (3) STUDENTS QUALIFIED FOR SPECIAL EDUCATION FUNDING 4 UNDER § 5–208 OF THIS TITLE;
 - (4) MAGNET STUDENTS; AND
- 6 (5) ALL OTHER STUDENTS.
- 7 (B) THE INFORMATION REQUIRED IN SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION 8 SHALL BE PROVIDED FOR EACH PUBLIC SCHOOL IN THE COUNTY.
- 9 (C) By December 1, 2015, and every 3 years thereafter, the 10 Department shall submit a copy of the reports received in 11 Accordance with subsection (a) of this section to the General 12 Assembly, as provided under § 2–1246 of the State Government 13 Article.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That it is the intent of the General Assembly that the per student amounts provided in the reports required under § 5–119 of the Education Article as enacted by this Act represent the actual amount of spending and not the amount budgeted per student.
- SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2014.
