Vehicle Laws - Ethnicity-Based or Race-Based Traffic Stops - Policy and
Reporting Requirements

- FOR the purpose of altering the meaning of "traffic stop" as it relates to certain policies and 4 reporting requirements; requiring certain law enforcement agencies to report certain 5 information to the Maryland Statistical Analysis Center; altering the categories of 6 ethnicity and race a law enforcement officer is required to report to the law 7 8 enforcement agency that employs the officer; requiring the Maryland Statistical 9 Analysis Center to make certain reports to the General Assembly, the Governor, and law enforcement agencies: altering a certain definition; repealing a termination 10 provision for certain provisions of law relating to policy and reporting requirements 11 for race—based traffic stops; making stylistic changes; altering a certain definition; 12 13 and generally relating to law enforcement procedures and traffic stops.

- 1 (b) The MARYLAND Police Training and Standards Commission, in consultation 2 with the Maryland Statistical Analysis Center, shall develop: 3 A model format for the efficient recording of data required under (1) 4 subsection (d) of this section on an electronic device, or by any other means, for use by a 5 law enforcement agency; 6 (2)Guidelines that each law enforcement agency may use as a 7 management tool to evaluate data collected by its officers for use in counseling and 8 improved training; 9 A standardized format that each law enforcement agency shall use in reporting data to the Maryland Statistical Analysis Center under subsection (e) of this 10 section: and 11 12 (4) A model policy against **ETHNICITY-BASED AND** race-based traffic stops that a law enforcement agency may use in developing its policy in accordance with 13 subsection (g) of this section. 14 15 Subject to paragraph (2) of this subsection, this THIS section applies 16 to each law enforcement agency that has one or more law enforcement officers. 17 Except as provided in subsection (e)(2) of this section, this section does **4**(2) 18 not apply to a law enforcement agency that is subject to an agreement with the United 19 States Department of Justice that requires the law enforcement agency to collect data on 20 the race or ethnicity of the drivers of motor vehicles stopped. 21Each time a law enforcement officer makes a traffic stop, that officer shall (d) 22 report the following information to the law enforcement agency that employs the officer 23using the format developed under subsection (b)(1) of this section: 24The date, location, and time of the stop; (1) 25(2) The approximate duration of the stop; 26 The traffic violation or violations alleged to have been committed that (3) 27 led to the stop; 28 Whether a search was conducted as a result of the stop; (4) 29 If a search was conducted, the reason for the search, whether the search

26 27 28	(g) (1) A law enforcement agency shall adopt a policy against race—based traffic stops that is to be used as a management tool to promote nondiscriminatory law enforcement and in the training and counseling of its officers.
29 30	(2) (i) The policy shall prohibit the practice of using an individual's race or ethnicity as the sole justification to initiate a traffic stop.
31	(ii) The policy shall make clear that it may not be construed to alter

the authority of a law enforcement officer to make an arrest, conduct a search or seizure,

or otherwise fulfill the officer's law enforcement obligations.
