3 FOR the purpose of altering the definition of "police officer" in connection with provisions 4 of law relating to the authority to make arrests to remove a member of the  $\mathbf{5}$ Department of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation Police Force; altering the definition 6 of "law enforcement officer" in connection with provisions of law relating to the 7 Maryland Police Training and Standards Commission and the Law Enforcement 8 Officers' Bill of Rights to remove a member of the Department of Labor, Licensing, 9 and Regulation Police Force; altering the membership of the Law Enforcement 10 Officers' Pension System to remove a member of the Department of Labor, Licensing, 11 and Regulation Police Force; altering the jurisdiction of the Maryland Capitol Police 12of the Department of General Services to include certain buildings and grounds 13 administered by the Department of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation on a certain date; providing for the transfer of certain functions, powers, and duties of the 14 15Department of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation Police Force to the Maryland 16Capitol Police of the Department of General Services on a certain date; providing for 17the transfer of certain employees to the Maryland Capitol Police of the Department 18 of General Services without diminution of certain rights, benefits, or employment or 19retirement status; requiring the publisher of the Annotated Code of Maryland, in 20consultation with and subject to the approval of the Department of Legislative 21Services, to correct any cross-references or terminology rendered incorrect by this 22Act and to describe any such corrections in an editor's note following the section 23affected; and generally relating to the Department of Labor, Licensing, and 24**Regulation Police Force.**

3 (a) (1)In accordance with the provisions of the State Personnel and Pensions 4 Article, the Secretary may establish a police and security force, known as the Maryland Capitol Police of the Department of General Services, to protect people and property on or  $\mathbf{5}$ 6 about improvements, grounds, and multiservice centers under the jurisdiction of the  $\overline{7}$ Department, and in the surrounding areas of the buildings and grounds in [Annapolis and 8 Baltimore City] THE STATE as described in § 4–601(1), (2), [and] (3), AND (4) of this 9 subtitle.

10 (2) The Maryland Capitol Police of the Department of General Services 11 may include sworn police officers.

12 (b) A member of the Maryland Capitol Police of the Department of General 13 Services may not be involuntarily transferred from a site to another site.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the publisher of the Annotated Code of Maryland, in consultation with and subject to the approval of the Department of Legislative Services, shall correct, with no further action required by the General Assembly, cross-references and terminology rendered incorrect by this Act. The publisher shall adequately describe any correction made in an editor's note following the section affected.

28 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the functions, powers, and 29 duties of the Department of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation Police Force shall be 30 transferred from the Department of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation to the Maryland 31 Capitol Police of the Department of General Services on the effective date of this Act.

32 SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That all employees who are 33 transferred to the Maryland Capitol Police of the Department of General Services as a 34 result of this Act shall be transferred on the effective date of this Act, without any 35 diminution of their rights, including collective bargaining rights, benefits, and employment 36 or retirement status.

37 SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July

1 1, 2019.
