### 1 AN ACT concerning

### 2 State Department of Education – Employment Categories and Practices

3 FOR the purpose of altering the employment categories of certain employees of the State 4 Department of Education; requiring that all positions in the Department be  $\mathbf{5}$ appointed positions in the professional service and skilled service as well as the 6 executive service and management service, subject to a certain exception; repealing 7 the authority for certain special appointment positions in the Department; altering 8 the procedures for the appointment, setting of qualifications, and transfer of 9 employees of the Department; specifying that certain employees serve at the 10 pleasure of the State Board of Education and the State Superintendent of Schools; 11 specifying that certain removal procedures apply to certain other employees; altering 12the removal procedures for certain employees; requiring that the Department 13 determine which employment classifications at the Department would be described 14 as being in the skilled service or the professional service; requiring that, beginning 15on a certain date, all employees hired by the Department in certain classifications 16 be hired, promoted, or transferred in accordance with certain requirements; and 17generally relating to the employment categories and practices of the State 18 Department of Education.

5 (d) (1) In addition to the other duties specified in this section, each 6 [professional assistant to] EMPLOYEE IN the Department has the duties assigned to him 7 by the State Superintendent.

8 (2) The Deputy State Superintendent designated by the State 9 Superintendent or by the State Board is the acting State Superintendent when the State 10 Superintendent is absent or disabled.

14 **[**(a) Unless otherwise provided by law, the State Superintendent shall appoint and 15 remove all clerical assistants and other nonprofessional personnel of the Department in 16 accordance with the provisions of the State Personnel and Pensions Article that govern the 17 skilled service, with the exception of special appointments.

18 (b)] The credential secretary and statistician of the Department are special 19 appointments in the State Personnel Management System.

# Article – State Personnel and Pensions

21 6-405.

(a) Except as otherwise provided by law, individuals in the following positions in
the skilled service and professional service are considered special appointments:

(3) as determined by the Secretary, a position which performs a significant
policy role or provides direct support to a member of the executive service;

26SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, on or before July 1, 2019, the 27State Department of Education shall determine which employment classifications at the 28Department would ordinarily be described as being in the skilled service or the professional 29service. Beginning on July 1, 2019, all employees hired by the Department in classifications that the Department determines would ordinarily be described as skilled or professional 30 31 shall be hired, promoted, or transferred in accordance with the requirements for skilled or 32professional employees under Title 6, Subtitle 4 of the State Personnel and Pensions 33 Article.

1 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 2 1, 2019.
