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Baltimore County - Elected School Board

3 FOR the purpose of establishing a procedure for the election of certain members of the 4 Baltimore County Board of Education; repealing certain provisions governing 5 the appointment of members of the Baltimore County Board of Education; 6 requiring the elected members of the county board to reside in, be a registered 7 voter in, and be elected from certain districts; establishing a certain term of 8 office for the elected members; specifying that a member may not be elected to 9 serve for more than a certain number of consecutive terms; providing for the 10 removal of members under certain circumstances; providing a procedure for 11 filling a vacancy for an elected member on the county board; providing for the 12 election of the chair and vice chair of the county board; providing for the 13 compensation of the members of the county board; providing for a School Board Redistricting Commission for Baltimore County; specifying the membership, 14 appointment process, powers and duties, staffing, and termination of the 15 Commission; providing for the termination of the terms of the appointed 16 17 members of the county board; providing for the staggering of the initial terms of 18 the elected members of the county board; making certain conforming 19 nomenclature changes; and generally relating to the election of members for the 20 Baltimore County Board of Education.
