

- 24 (III) INCLUDES APPROPRIATE EVIDENCE THAT THE OWNER OF 25 THE PROPERTY IN WHICH THE *NONPROFIT* BEER FESTIVAL MAY BE HELD HAS GIVEN 26 PERMISSION TO THE APPLICANT TO HAVE THE *NONPROFIT* BEER FESTIVAL ON ITS 27 PREMISES; AND
