1 AN ACT concerning

State Employee and Retiree Health and Welfare Benefits Program – Participation

FOR the purpose of requiring certain employment with a certain community college to be
included in the calculation of State service to determine eligibility to participate as
a retiree in the State Employee and Retiree Health and Welfare Benefits Program;
requiring an individual to be considered an employee of the State on or before a
certain date under certain circumstances; and generally relating to retiree
participation in the State Employee and Retiree Health and Welfare Benefits
Program.

- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article – State Personnel and Pensions

(a) (1) This subsection applies to a retiree of an optional retirement program
under Title 30 of this article who began service as an employee of the State in the Executive,
Legislative, or Judicial Branch of government on or before June 30, 2011.

(2) (i) Subject to subparagraph (ii) of this paragraph, an individual may
 enroll and participate in the health insurance benefit options established under the
 Program if the individual retired under an optional program under Title 30 of this article

9 (3) (i) An enrollee under this section who was in service with a State 10 institution of higher education at the time of the retirement is entitled to the same State 11 subsidy allowed a retiree under § 2–508(b)(4) of this subtitle. However, except as provided 12 in subparagraph (ii) of this paragraph, the subsidy shall apply only to the costs of coverage 13 for the enrollee and may not apply to any additional costs of coverage for the enrollee's 14 spouse or children.

15 (ii) If the enrollee has 25 or more years of service as an employee of 16 the State in the Executive, Legislative, or Judicial Branch of government, the enrollee or 17 the enrollee's surviving spouse or dependent child is entitled to the same State subsidy 18 allowed a retiree with 16 or more years of creditable service under § 2–508(b)(4)(i) of this 19 subtitle.

20 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 21 1, 2020.
