4 FOR the purpose of requiring that a county ~~or municipal~~ employee who serves as an election
5 judge during hours that the employee is scheduled to work for the county ~~or the~~
6 ~~municipal corporation~~ receive certain administrative leave and certain election judge
7 compensation; making a clarifying change; and generally relating to administrative
8 leave for county ~~and municipal~~ employees who serve as election judges.

14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
15 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

16 **Article – Election Law**

18 (d) A State, ~~COUNTY, OR MUNICIPAL~~ OR COUNTY employee who serves as an
19 election judge during hours that the employee is otherwise scheduled to work for the State,
20 ~~THE COUNTY, OR THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATION~~ OR COUNTY SHALL RECEIVE:

1 (1) [may use] 1 hour of administrative leave for each hour of service as an
2 election judge, up to a total of 8 hours for each day of service; and

3 (2) [shall receive] the election judge compensation as specified in § 10–205
4 of this subtitle.

5 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
6 October 1, 2019.
