
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Veterans - Behavioral Health Services - Mental Health First Aid

3 FOR the purpose of requiring that the behavioral health services for which the Maryland 4 Department of Health provides service coordination for veterans under certain 5 provisions of law include mental health first aid; requiring that mental health first 6 aid consist of training for veterans and the immediate family members of veterans 7 on how to identify and respond to signs of mental illness and substance use disorders; 8 requiring certain entities to report certain information to the Department; requiring 9 the Department, annually beginning on a certain date and under certain circumstances, to report certain information to the Governor and the General 10 11 Assembly; making conforming changes; and generally relating to mental health first 12 aid for veterans.
