CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Carroll County – Gaming – Repeal of Sunday Prohibition**

3 FOR the purpose of repealing the provision of law prohibiting in Carroll County the
4 issuance of a permit authorizing the operation of a card game, card tournament, or
5 casino event after a certain hour on Sunday; and generally relating to gaming in
6 Carroll County.

7 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

13 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

14 **Article – Criminal Law**

15 13–906.1.

16 (a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.

17 (2) “Casino event” includes the play of card games, dice games, and
18 roulette.

1 (3) “Permit” means a permit to conduct a card game, card tournament, or
2 casino event.

3 (b) Before an organization may conduct a card game, card tournament, or casino
4 event, the organization shall obtain a permit from the Board of County Commissioners for
5 Carroll County.

6 (c) To qualify for a permit, an organization shall be a bona fide:

7 (1) amateur athletic organization;

8 (2) charitable organization;

9 (3) civic organization;

10 (4) fraternal organization;

11 (5) hospital;

12 (6) religious organization;

13 (7) volunteer fire company; or

14 (8) war veterans’ organization.

15 (d) (1) A card game, card tournament, or casino event may be:

16 (i) managed and operated by the organization that is the permit
17 holder; or

18 (ii) managed by the organization that is the permit holder and
19 operated by another organization listed in subsection (c) of this section.

20 (2) (i) An operator of a card game, card tournament, or casino event
21 may not receive compensation.

22 (ii) To volunteer as an operator of a card game, card tournament, or
23 casino event, an individual shall be at least 18 years old.

24 (iii) To participate in a card game, card tournament, or casino event,
25 an individual shall be at least 21 years old.

26 (e) (1) An organization that is the permit holder may receive not more than
27 four permits in a calendar year.

28 (2) A card game, card tournament, or casino event may not last longer than
29 24 consecutive hours.

1 (f) A permit is not transferable.

2 (g) (1) Proceeds from a card game, card tournament, or casino event conducted
3 under this section:

4 (i) shall be used to benefit a charity or to further the purpose of the
5 permit holder; and

6 (ii) except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, may not
7 be used for the financial benefit or the personal use of an individual or a group of
8 individuals.

9 (2) On approval of the Board of County Commissioners for Carroll County,
10 proceeds may be used to benefit a family with medical needs.

11 (h) [A permit may not authorize the operation of a card game, card tournament,
12 or casino event after 1 a.m. on Sunday.

13 (i) (1) An organization that is the permit holder may charge only a preset
14 entrance fee for a card game, card tournament, or casino event.

15 (2) Participants in a card game, card tournament, or casino event shall
16 receive tokens for wagering in exchange for the entrance fee.

17 (3) A participant may purchase additional tokens, at a total cost not
18 exceeding 100% of the entrance fee, during a card game, card tournament, or casino event.

19 (4) An organization that is the permit holder may not allow cash to be used
20 for wagering.

21 [(j)] (I) An organization that is the permit holder may not exchange tokens
22 used in wagering for:

23 (1) an item of merchandise that is worth more than \$10,000;

24 (2) money; or

25 (3) an item of merchandise having a value that is different from the fair
26 market retail value of the item of merchandise that was received for the tokens.

27 [(k)] (J) Within 60 days after holding a card game, card tournament, or casino
28 event, the organization that is the permit holder shall submit to the Board of County
29 Commissioners for Carroll County:

30 (1) a financial report that lists the receipts and expenditures for the card
31 game, card tournament, or casino event; and

1 (2) the name, address, and Social Security number of a participant that is
2 declared the winner at a card game, card tournament, or casino event of a prize for which
3 issuance of Internal Revenue Service Form W-2G or a substantially equivalent form is
4 required.

5 **[(l)] (K)** In addition to being subject to § 13-909 of this subtitle, an organization
6 that is found to have violated this section is ineligible to receive a permit under this section
7 for a period of 5 years.

8 **[(m)] (L)** The Board of County Commissioners for Carroll County may adopt
9 regulations to carry out this section, including regulations to govern:

10 (1) the issuing of permits;

11 (2) permit fees; and

12 (3) the conduct and management of a card game, card tournament, or
13 casino event in a manner to prevent fraud and protect the public.

14 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
15 October 1, 2018.
