## **Criminal Law – Decriminalization of Attempted Suicide**

- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 12 13That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

1 (B) THE ACT OF ATTEMPTING TO COMMIT SUICIDE, IN ITSELF, MAY NOT 2 FORM THE BASIS OF A CRIMINAL CHARGE AGAINST THE PERSON WHO ATTEMPTED 3 TO COMMIT SUICIDE.

# 4(C)THIS SECTION MAY NOT BE CONSTRUED TO PROHIBIT A PERSON WHO5COMMITS ONE OR MORE CRIMES IN THE COURSE OF ATTEMPTING TO COMMIT6SUICIDE FROM BEING CHARGED WITH THE OTHER CRIME OR CRIMES.

- 7 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the common law offense of 8 attempted suicide is hereby abrogated and repealed.
- 9 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 10 October 1, 2019.
