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1 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 2 1, 2019. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and, at the end of June 30, 2020, this 3 Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no 4 further force and effect.
