- 13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

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Article – Correctional Services

(a) On or before October 31 of each year, the Commissioner shall submit an
annual report to the Secretary and the Governor that states, for each correctional facility
in the Division:

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(1) its expenses, receipts, disbursements, condition, and progress;

21 (2) the number of inmates and each inmate's age, sex, race, place of birth 22 and conviction, crime, and term of confinement;

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1 (3) LIST THE JOB CLASSIFICATIONS FOR INMATE LABOR IN EACH 2 DEPARTMENT AND FACILITY UNDER THE AUTHORITY OF MARYLAND 3 CORRECTIONAL ENTERPRISES;

4 (4) LIST THE DAILY WAGE SCALE AT EACH PRISON FOR EACH JOB 5 CLASSIFICATION UNDER THE AUTHORITY OF MARYLAND CORRECTIONAL 6 ENTERPRISES; AND

7 (5) LIST THE TOTAL NUMBER OF INMATES CURRENTLY EMPLOYED AT 8 FACILITIES UNDER THE AUTHORITY OF MARYLAND CORRECTIONAL ENTERPRISES, 9 DISAGGREGATED BY FACILITY.

10 (c) The Governor, the Secretary, and the Secretary of Budget and Management 11 may include data from the report submitted under this section in the preparation of the 12 budget and capital improvement bill.

13 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect14 October 1, 2019.
