FOR the purpose of requiring the Department of Legislative Services to include certain 4 5 information in a preliminary evaluation report of certain governmental activities or 6 units; requiring the Department to conduct a certain full evaluation of certain 7 governmental activities or units in certain years and every specified period of years 8 thereafter; requiring the Department to conduct subsequent full evaluations of 9 certain entities under certain circumstances; requiring the Department to complete certain full evaluations by a certain day in an evaluation year; altering a certain 10 11 definition; making a certain clarifying change; and generally relating to full 12 evaluations conducted under the Maryland Program Evaluation Act.
