18 19	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

determine Maryland adjusted gross income.



- 1 (l) (1) The subtraction under subsection (a) of this section includes an amount equal to [\$3,500] THE AMOUNT SPECIFIED IN PARAGRAPH (3) OF THIS SUBSECTION if an individual is a qualifying police auxiliary or reserve volunteer for the taxable year, as determined under paragraph (2) of this subsection.

- 11 qualifies for active status during the taxable year under a 12 police auxiliary or reserve volunteer program approved by the Police Training Commission 13 in conjunction with the Maryland Association of Counties and the Maryland Municipal 14 League, that includes uniform systems for qualification and record keeping, if the program 15 is incorporated into the police agency's rules and regulations;

- 3. is a member of the National Guard or other reserve component of the United States armed forces who has been ordered into active military service and who serves on active duty in the armed forces of the United States during the taxable year; or
- 4. is a civilian or a member of the Merchant Marine on assignment in support of the armed forces of the United States during the taxable year in an area designated as a combat zone by executive order of the President; and
