FOR the purpose of requiring the Executive Director of the Department of Legislative 4 5 Services to ensure that the responsibilities of the offices of the Department are 6 carried out; altering the offices that comprise the Department; altering certain duties 7 of the Department to review certain reporting requirements; establishing the Office 8 of Operations and Support Services in the Department; repealing certain provisions 9 relating to the organization and duties of the Office of the Executive Director and the Office of Legislative Information Systems; providing that the Office of Policy 10 11 Analysis is not required to prepare an analysis of certain enabling acts under certain 12 circumstances; requiring a certain unit of State government to respond to a request 13 from the Office of Policy Analysis for certain information within a certain period of 14 time except under certain circumstances; requiring the Department, in consultation with the Department of Budget and Management, to study the effectiveness and 15 16 accessibility to the public of goals developed in a certain managing for results State 17 comprehensive plan on or before a certain date; requiring the study to include an 18 evaluation of and recommendations on the creation of a certain performance 19 measurement system; defining certain terms; making certain conforming changes; 20 and generally relating to the Department of Legislative Services.


