Task Force to Study Transportation Access

- 3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Task Force to Study Transportation Access; stating 4 the purpose of the Task Force; providing for the composition, chair, and staffing of 5 the Task Force; authorizing the Task Force to establish subcommittees; prohibiting 6 a member of the Task Force from receiving certain compensation, but authorizing 7 the reimbursement of certain expenses; requiring the Task Force to study and make 8 recommendations regarding certain matters; requiring the Task Force to report its 9 interim and final findings and recommendations to the Governor and the General 10 Assembly on or before a certain date; defining certain terms; providing for the 11 termination of this Act; and generally relating to the Task Force to Study 12 Transportation Access.
- 13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 14 That:
- 15 (a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.
- 16 (2) "MTA" means the Maryland Transit Administration.
- 17 (3) "Task Force" means the Task Force to Study Transportation Access.
- 18 (4) "WMATA" means the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit 19 Authority.

- 10 (8) review and summarize findings of current and projected unmet 11 transportation access needs across the State;
- 12 (9) make recommendations to optimize the use and coordination of existing 13 transportation systems, services, and assets, including recommended extensions of existing 14 routes or schedules for MTA, WMATA, locally operated transit systems, and private vehicle 15 services; and
- 16 (10) make recommendations regarding the need for additional resources, planning, or systems to address current or projected needs.
- 18 (j) (1) On or before June 30, 2020, the Task Force shall submit an interim 19 report of its findings and recommendations to the Governor and, in accordance with § 20 2–1246 of the State Government Article, the General Assembly.
- 21 (2) On or before December 1, 2021, the Task Force shall submit a final report of its findings and recommendations to the Governor and, in accordance with § 23 2–1246 of the State Government Article, the General Assembly.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2019. It shall remain effective for a period of 3 years and, at the end of June 30, 2022, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
