A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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Unregulated Space in Hospital Operating Suites Pilot Project

3 FOR the purpose of establishing an unregulated space in hospital operating suites pilot project; requiring the pilot project to be operated by the Health Services Cost Review 4 5 Commission; authorizing the Commission to allow up to five hospitals to participate 6 in the pilot project; providing that certain hospitals may be subject to a certain rate 7 determination; authorizing certain hospitals to make available certain operating 8 room space to certain patients and payers under certain conditions; requiring the 9 Commission to develop certain criteria and standards for the pilot project; requiring the Commission to report to certain committees of the General Assembly on or before 10 11 a certain date each year; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally 12 relating to the unregulated space in hospital operating suites pilot project.

- 18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 19 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 20 Article Health General
- 21 **19–209.**
- 22 (A) THERE IS AN UNREGULATED SPACE IN HOSPITAL OPERATING SUITES 23 PILOT PROJECT.
- 24 (B) THE PILOT PROJECT SHALL BE OPERATED BY THE COMMISSION.

- 1 (C) (1) THE COMMISSION IS AUTHORIZED TO ALLOW UP TO FIVE 2 HOSPITALS TO PARTICIPATE IN THE PILOT PROJECT.
- 3 (2) A HOSPITAL PARTICIPATING IN THE PILOT PROJECT MAY BE
- 4 SUBJECT TO AN ALTERNATE METHOD OF RATE DETERMINATION, INCLUDING AN
- 5 EXEMPTION FROM RATES THAT ALLOWS UNREGULATED OPERATING ROOM SPACE
- 6 TO BE PHYSICALLY LOCATED WITHIN A REGULATED FACILITY.
- 7 (3) A HOSPITAL PARTICIPATING IN THE PILOT PROJECT IS
- 8 AUTHORIZED TO MAKE AVAILABLE UNREGULATED OPERATING ROOM SPACE TO ALL
- 9 PATIENTS AND ALL PAYERS, WITH NO DUPLICATION OF SERVICES IN REGULATED
- 10 OPERATING ROOM SPACE.
- 11 (D) THE COMMISSION SHALL DEVELOP CRITERIA AND STANDARDS FOR
- 12 HOSPITALS PARTICIPATING IN THE PILOT PROJECT INCLUDING THAT:
- 13 (1) A PARTICIPATING HOSPITAL SHALL OFFER CHARITY CARE
- 14 CONSISTENT WITH REGULATED HOSPITAL SERVICES;
- 15 (2) THE BILLED CHARGE FOR A SERVICE MAY NOT BE HIGHER THAN
- 16 THE PARTICIPATING HOSPITAL'S BILLED CHARGE FOR A SIMILAR SERVICE;
- 17 (3) THE COST TO THE MEDICAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM AND
- 18 MEDICARE SHALL BE LOWER THAN A SIMILAR REGULATED HOSPITAL SERVICE; AND
- 19 (4) A PARTICIPATING HOSPITAL SHALL INCREASE CONSUMER
- 20 AWARENESS AND EDUCATION ABOUT REGULATED AND NONREGULATED SERVICES,
- 21 INCLUDING THE POTENTIAL FOR ADDITIONAL BILLED CHARGES FROM PHYSICIANS.
- 22 (E) ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 1 EACH YEAR, THE COMMISSION SHALL
- 23 REPORT, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2–1246 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE,
- 24 TO THE SENATE FINANCE COMMITTEE AND THE HOUSE HEALTH AND
- 25 GOVERNMENT OPERATIONS COMMITTEE ON:
- 26 (1) THE TYPES OF PROCEDURES THAT HAVE OCCURRED IN A
- 27 PARTICIPATING HOSPITAL'S UNREGULATED OPERATING ROOM SPACE;
- 28 (2) THE COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH A HOSPITAL'S PARTICIPATION IN
- 29 THE PILOT PROJECT; AND
- 30 (3) The effects of the pilot project on the Maryland
- 31 ALL-PAYER MODEL.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2019. It shall remain effective for a period of 3 years and, at the end of June 30, 2022, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
