Baltimore City – 45th District – Alcoholic Beverages – Exchange of Class B <u>and</u> <u>Class C</u> Beer, Wine, and Liquor <u>Licenses</u>
FOR the purpose of authorizing a Class B beer, wine, and liquor license holder in a certain legislative district to exchange the license for a Class B–D–7 beer, wine, and liquor license if the licensed premises is in an area bounded by certain streets and an applicant executes a memorandum of understanding with a certain community association; providing that a certain license holder is authorized to provide outdoor table service; authorizing the Board of License Commissioners for Baltimore City to make issuance or renewal of a certain license conditional on the substantial
