1 AN ACT concerning

Public Safety – Hotels <u>and Lodging or Rooming Houses</u> – Carbon Monoxide Alarms

FOR the purpose of altering the applicability to certain hotels and lodging or rooming 4 houses of certain provisions of law concerning carbon monoxide alarms; altering a $\mathbf{5}$ certain reference to a certain alarm device national standard; requiring certain hotels 6 7 and lodging or rooming houses, on or after a certain date, to install a certain carbon 8 monoxide alarm inside each guest room on the ceiling wall of certain rooms and areas 9 within the hotel or lodging or rooming house under certain circumstances; authorizing the owner of a hotel or lodging or rooming house to install a certain 10 carbon monoxide alarm within a certain distance from carbon monoxide-producing 11 12fixtures and equipment within the hotel or lodging or rooming house under certain 13 circumstances; altering a certain definition; defining a certain term terms; making 14this Act an emergency measure; and generally relating to carbon monoxide alarms.
