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## Education - Robotics Grant Program - Alterations

- FOR the purpose of expanding eligibility requirements for the Robotics Grant Program to include certain nonprofit organizations and community clubs; repealing the requirement for existing nonprofit robotics clubs to be associated with a public school to be eligible for the Program; requiring the Governor to increase a certain appropriation to the Program in the State budget; and generally relating to the Robotics Grant Program.

- 14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 15 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

## 16 Article – Education

- 18 (a) (1) There is a Robotics Grant Program in the State.
- 19 (2) The purpose of the Program is to provide grants to public schools [and], 20 nonprofit [robotics] ORGANIZATIONS, AND COMMUNITY clubs in the State to support 21 existing robotics programs and to increase the number of robotics programs in the State.
- 22 (b) [(1)] A school, A NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION, OR A COMMUNITY CLUB is eligible to receive a grant under this section if the school, NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION,



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- OR COMMUNITY CLUB is proposing a new robotics program or club or has an existing robotics program or club.
- 3 **[**(2) An existing nonprofit robotics club is eligible to receive a grant under 4 this section if the nonprofit robotics club is associated with a public school.]
- 5 (c) The Governor shall include in the State budget an annual appropriation of at 6 least [\$250,000] **\$500,000** to the Program.
- 7 (d) The Department shall implement and administer the Program in accordance 8 with this section.
- 9 (e) The Department may adopt regulations to implement the requirements of this 10 section.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2019.
