Secretary of Smart Growth; renaming the Smart Growth Subcabinet to be the
Sustainable Growth Subcabinet; altering the membership and duties of the
Subcabinet; and generally relating to the Sustainable Growth Subcabinet and the
repeal of the Office of Smart Growth.
