BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 11 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 12 13 Article - Health Occupations 12-403. 14 15 (b) Except as otherwise provided in this section, a pharmacy for which a pharmacy permit has been issued under this title: 16 17 With regard to a prescription drug that is delivered in this State by 18 the United States mail, a common carrier, or a delivery service and is not personally 19 hand delivered directly to a patient or to the agent of the patient at the residence of the patient or at another location designated by the patient, shall: 20 21Provide a general written notice in each shipment of a 22 prescription drug that alerts a consumer that, under certain circumstances, a

- (ii) Provide a specific written notice in each shipment of a prescription drug that provides a consumer with a toll–free or local consumer access telephone number accessible during regular hours of operation, which is designed to respond to consumer questions pertaining to medications; AND
- 7 (III) REQUIRE AN ADULT TO SIGN FOR THE DELIVERY OF A 8 PRESCRIPTION DRUG THAT IS A CONTROLLED DANGEROUS SUBSTANCE, AS 9 DEFINED IN § 5–101 OF THE CRIMINAL LAW ARTICLE, TO A RESIDENCE;
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2010.
