CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Maryland Uniform Transfers to Minors Act – Orphans’ Court**

3 FOR the purpose of altering the definition of the term “court” to include an orphans’
4 court or a court exercising the jurisdiction of an orphans’ court for the purposes
5 of the Maryland Uniform Transfers to Minors Act; and generally relating to the
6 Maryland Uniform Transfers to Minors Act.

18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
19 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

20 **Article – Estates and Trusts**

2 (a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated.

3 (e) "Court" means [the circuit courts] **A CIRCUIT COURT, AN ORPHANS'**
4 **COURT, OR A COURT EXERCISING THE JURISDICTION OF AN ORPHANS' COURT.**

5 13-306.

6 (a) Subject to subsection (c) of this section, a personal representative or
7 trustee may make an irrevocable transfer to another adult or trust company as
8 custodian for the benefit of a minor pursuant to § 13-309 of this subtitle, in the
9 absence of a will or under a will or trust that does not contain an authorization to do
10 so.

11 (b) Subject to subsection (c) of this section, a conservator may make an
12 irrevocable transfer to another adult or trust company as custodian for the benefit of
13 the minor pursuant to § 13-309 of this subtitle.

14 (c) A transfer under subsection (a) or (b) of this section may be made only if:

15 (1) The personal representative, trustee, or conservator considers the
16 transfer to be in the best interest of the minor;

17 (2) The transfer is not prohibited by or inconsistent with provisions of
18 the applicable will, trust agreement, or other governing instrument; and

19 (3) The transfer is authorized by the court if it exceeds \$10,000 in
20 value.

21 13-309.

22 (a) Custodial property is created and a transfer is made whenever:

23 (1) An uncertificated security or a certificated security in registered
24 form is either:

25 (i) Registered in the name of the transferor, an adult other
26 than the transferor, or a trust company, followed in substance by the words: "As
27 custodian for _____ (name of minor) under the Maryland Uniform Transfers to
28 Minors Act"; or

29 (ii) Delivered if in certificated form, or any document necessary
30 for the transfer of an uncertificated security is delivered, together with any necessary
31 endorsement to an adult other than the transferor or to a trust company as custodian,
32 accompanied by an instrument in substantially the form set forth in subsection (b) of
33 this section;

1 (2) Money is paid or delivered to a broker or financial institution for
2 credit to an account in the name of the transferor, an adult other than the transferor,
3 or a trust company, followed in substance by the words: “As custodian for _____
4 (name of minor) under the Maryland Uniform Transfers to Minors Act”;

5 (3) The ownership of a life or endowment insurance policy or annuity
6 contract is either:

7 (i) Registered with the issuer in the name of the transferor, an
8 adult other than the transferor, or a trust company, followed in substance by the
9 words: “As custodian for _____ (name of minor) under the Maryland Uniform
10 Transfers to Minors Act”; or

11 (ii) Assigned in a writing delivered to an adult other than the
12 transferor or to a trust company whose name in the assignment is followed in
13 substance by the words: “As custodian for _____ (name of minor) under the
14 Maryland Uniform Transfers to Minors Act”;

15 (4) An irrevocable exercise of a power of appointment or an irrevocable
16 present right to future payment under a contract is the subject of a written
17 notification delivered to the payor, issuer, or other obligor that the right is transferred
18 to the transferor, an adult other than the transferor, or a trust company, whose name
19 in the notification is followed in substance by the words: “As custodian for _____
20 (name of minor) under the Maryland Uniform Transfers to Minors Act”;

21 (5) An interest in real property is recorded in the name of the
22 transferor, an adult other than the transferor, or a trust company, followed in
23 substance by the words: “As custodian for _____ (name of minor) under the
24 Maryland Uniform Transfers to Minors Act”;

25 (6) A certificate of title issued by a department or agency of a state or
26 of the United States which evidences title to tangible personal property is either:

27 (i) Issued in the name of the transferor, an adult other than the
28 transferor, or a trust company, followed in substance by the words: “As custodian for
29 _____ (name of minor) under the Maryland Uniform Transfers to Minors Act”; or

30 (ii) Delivered to an adult other than the transferor or to a trust
31 company, endorsed to that person, followed in substance by the words: “As custodian
32 for _____ (name of minor) under the Maryland Uniform Transfers to Minors Act”;
33 or

34 (7) An interest in any property not described in paragraphs (1)
35 through (6) of this subsection is transferred to an adult other than the transferor or to
36 a trust company by a written instrument in substantially the form set forth in
37 subsection (b) of this section.

1 (b) An instrument in the following form satisfies the requirements of
2 subsection (a)(1)(ii) and (7) of this section:

3 “Transfer Under the Maryland Uniform

4 Transfers to Minors Act

5 I, _____ (name of transferor or name and representative capacity if a
6 fiduciary) hereby transfer to _____ (name of custodian), as custodian for
7 _____ (name of minor) under the Maryland Uniform Transfers to Minors Act, the
8 following: (insert a description of the custodial property sufficient to identify it).

18 (c) A transferor shall place the custodian in control of the custodial property
19 as soon as practicable.

20 13–312.

21 (a) A custodian shall:

22 (1) Take control of custodial property;

23 (2) Register or record title to custodial property if appropriate; and

24 (3) Collect, hold, manage, invest, and reinvest custodial property.

25 13–314.

26 (c) On petition of an interested person or the minor if the minor has attained
27 the age of 14 years, the court may order the custodian to deliver or pay to the minor or
28 expend for the minor’s benefit so much of the custodial property as the court considers
29 advisable for the use and benefit of the minor.

1 (d) A delivery, payment, or expenditure under this section is in addition to,
2 not in substitution for, and does not affect any obligation of a person to support the
3 minor.

4 13–318.

5 (d) (1) If a custodian is ineligible, dies, or becomes incapacitated without
6 having effectively designated a successor and the minor has attained the age of 14
7 years, the minor may designate as successor custodian, in the manner prescribed in
8 subsection (b) of this section, an adult member of the minor's family, a conservator of
9 the minor, or a trust company.

10 (2) If the minor has not attained the age of 14 years or fails to act
11 within 60 days after the ineligibility, death, or incapacity, the conservator of the minor
12 becomes successor custodian.

13 (3) If the minor has no conservator or the conservator declines to act,
14 the transferor, the legal representative of the transferor or of the custodian, an adult
15 member of the minor's family, or any other interested person may petition the court to
16 designate a successor custodian.

17 (f) A transferor, the legal representative of a transferor, an adult member of
18 the minor's family, a guardian of the person of the minor, the conservator of the minor,
19 or the minor if the minor has attained the age of 14 years may petition the court to
20 remove the custodian for cause and to designate a successor custodian other than a
21 transferor under § 13–304 of this subtitle or to require the custodian to give
22 appropriate bond.

23 13–319.

24 (a) A minor who has attained the age of 14 years, the minor's guardian of the
25 person or legal representative, an adult member of the minor's family, a transferor, or
26 a transferor's legal representative may petition the court for:

27 (1) An accounting by the custodian or the custodian's legal
28 representative; or

29 (2) A determination of responsibility, as between the custodial
30 property and the custodian personally, for claims against the custodial property unless
31 the responsibility has been adjudicated in an action under § 13–317 of this subtitle to
32 which the minor or the minor's legal representative was a party.

33 (b) A successor custodian may petition the court for an accounting by the
34 predecessor custodian.

35 (c) The court, in a proceeding under this subtitle or in any other proceeding,
36 may require or permit the custodian or the custodian's legal representative to account.

1 (d) If a custodian is removed under § 13-318(f) of this subtitle, the court
2 shall require an accounting and order delivery of the custodial property and records to
3 the successor custodian and the execution of all instruments required for transfer of
4 the custodial property.

6 This subtitle may be cited as the “Maryland Uniform Transfers to Minors Act”.

7 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
8 October 1, 2012.
