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Developmental Disabilities – Group Homes and Alternative Living Units – Dispersion

FOR the purpose of stating the intent of the General Assembly with regard to the dispersion of group homes and alternative living units; requiring a group home or an alternative living unit to maintain a certain distance from certain facilities; limiting the number of group homes or alternative living units in a certain area based on population size; exempting group homes or alternative living units operational before a certain date from the requirements of this Act; and generally relating to group homes and alternative living units.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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20 (A) IT IS THE INTENT OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY THAT GROUP HOMES
21 AND ALTERNATIVE LIVING UNITS BE DISPERSED THROUGHOUT THE STATE IN
22 ORDER TO INTEGRATE INDIVIDUALS WITH DISABILITIES INTO THE COMMUNITY
23 AND TO AVOID THE CREATION OF AN INSTITUTIONAL ENVIRONMENT.
