- 4 (a) A nonprofit organization is qualified to receive a grant in accordance with this subtitle if the Department determines that the nonprofit organization has a demonstrated record of:
- 7 (1) [Building a statewide network;
- 8 (2)] Designing and implementing successful healthy food incentive 9 programs that connect federal food benefits recipients with local producers;
- 10 [(3)] (2) Implementing funds distributing and reporting processes;
- 11 [(4)] (3) Providing training and technical assistance to farmers markets;
- 12 **[(5)] (4)** Conducting community outreach and data collection, including 13 customer surveys; and
- 14 **[**(6)**] (5)** Providing a full accounting and administration of funds 15 distributed to farmers markets.
- 16 (b) Within 90 days after the end of a grant cycle, a qualified nonprofit organization that received a grant in accordance with this subtitle shall submit a report to the Department that includes the following information:
- 19 (1) The names and locations of Maryland farmers markets that received 20 funds under the Program;
- 21 (2) The dollar amount of funds awarded to each participating farmers 22 market;
- 23 (3) The dollar amount of FMNP, SNAP, and WIC benefits, and funds provided under the Program that were spent at participating farmers markets, as well as any unspent funds;
- 26 (4) The number of FMNP, SNAP, and WIC transactions carried out at participating farmers markets; and
- 28 (5) The impact of the Program on increasing the quantity of fresh fruits 29 and vegetables consumed by FMNP, SNAP, and WIC families, as determined by customer 30 surveys.
