2 (A) The Program shall reimburse health care providers in accordance with 3 the requirements of Title 19, Subtitle 1, Part IV of this article.

4 (B) UNLESS OTHERWISE SPECIFICALLY PROHIBITED OR LIMITED BY 5 FEDERAL OR STATE LAW, THE PROGRAM SHALL REIMBURSE A HEALTH CARE 6 PROVIDER FOR A HEALTH CARE SERVICE DELIVERED BY TELEMEDICINE, AS 7 DEFINED IN § 15–139 OF THE INSURANCE ARTICLE, IN THE SAME MANNER AS 8 THE SAME HEALTH CARE SERVICE IS REIMBURSED WHEN DELIVERED IN 9 PERSON.

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12 (a) (1) In this section, "telemedicine" means, as it relates to the delivery of 13 health care services, the use of interactive audio, video, or other telecommunications 14 or electronic technology by a licensed health care provider to deliver a health care 15 service within the scope of practice of the health care provider at a site other than the 16 site at which the patient is located.

17 (2) "Telemedicine" does not include:

18 (i) an audio-only telephone conversation between a health care
19 provider and a patient;

20 (ii) an electronic mail message between a health care provider 21 and a patient; or

(iii) a facsimile transmission between a health care provider anda patient.

24 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 25 October 1, 2013.
