### **Environment – Decabrominated Diphenyl Ether – Prohibitions**

- 3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting, on or after certain dates, the manufacturing, 4 processing, or distributing of certain products that contain decabrominated  $\mathbf{5}$ diphenyl ether; providing that this Act does not prohibit certain retailers from 6 selling, recycling, or disposing of certain products that contain decabrominated 7diphenyl ether under certain circumstances; providing that this Act does not 8 prohibit a person from transporting or storing certain products that contain 9 decabrominated diphenyl ether under certain circumstances; defining a certain 10 term; and generally relating to the use of decabrominated diphenyl ether.

4 (1) A RETAILER THAT IS IN POSSESSION OF A PRODUCT 5 PROHIBITED FOR MANUFACTURE, SALE, OR DISTRIBUTION FOR SALE UNDER 6 SUBSECTIONS (A) AND (B) OF THIS SECTION ON OR AFTER DECEMBER 31, 2013, 7 FROM SELLING, RECYCLING, OR OTHERWISE DISPOSING OF THE REMAINING 8 INVENTORY OF THE PRODUCT; OR

9 (2) A PERSON FROM TRANSPORTING OR STORING A PRODUCT 10 PROHIBITED UNDER SUBSECTIONS (A) AND (B) OF THIS SECTION FOR LATER 11 DISTRIBUTION OUTSIDE THE STATE.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effectOctober 1, 2010.
