11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 12 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 13 Article Election Law
- 14 16–206.
- 15 (a) A person may not:
- 16 (1) place any distinguishing mark on the person's own or another 17 person's ballot for the purpose of identifying the ballot;
- 18 (2) misrepresent the person's ability to mark a ballot or operate voting19 equipment;
- 20 (3) interfere or attempt to interfere with a voter while the voter is 21 inside the polling room, marking a ballot, or operating voting equipment;

EXPLANATION: CAPITALS INDICATE MATTER ADDED TO EXISTING LAW. [Brackets] indicate matter deleted from existing law.

1 (4) induce or attempt to induce a voter to mark the voter's ballot in a 2 certain way;

3 (5) except for servicing by an authorized person, unlock any locked 4 compartment of a voting device unless instructed to do so by the election director;

(6) destroy or deface a ballot;

6 (7) remove a ballot from a building in which voting occurs, except as 7 otherwise provided in this article;

- (8) delay the delivery of a ballot;

9 (9) possess on or before the day of election an official ballot printed for 10 the election, unless the possession of the ballot is necessary and appropriate for 11 carrying out the election process; or

(10) canvass, electioneer, or post any campaign material in the polling
 place or beyond a line established by signs posted in accordance with subsection (b) of
 this section.

15 (b) (1) At each polling place, one election judge from each principal 16 political party shall be designated by the local board and, acting jointly, shall post 17 signs delineating a line around the entrance and exit of the building that are closest to 18 that part of the building in which voting occurs.

19 (2) The line shall be located as near as practicable to [100] **25** feet 20 from the entrance and exit and shall be established after consideration of the 21 configuration of the entrance and the effect of placement on public safety and the flow 22 of pedestrian and vehicular traffic.

23 (3) The signs shall contain the words "No Electioneering Beyond this24 Point".

(c) A person who violates this section is guilty of a misdemeanor and is
subject to a fine of not less than \$50 nor more than \$500 or imprisonment for not more
than 60 days or both.

28 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
 29 June 1, 2010.
