3 4 5 6	FOR the purpose of specifying that a certain Class B–D–7 license is considered to be unexpired until a certain date for a certain purpose in Baltimore City; making this Act an emergency measure; and generally relating to alcoholic beverages licenses issued in Baltimore City.
7 8 9 10	BY repealing and reenacting, without amendments, Article – Alcoholic Beverages Section 12–102, 12–905, and 12–1705 Annotated Code of Maryland (2016 Volume and 2017 Supplement)

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

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16 This title applies only in Baltimore City.

That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 17 12–905.
- 18 (a) There is a Class B–D–7 beer, wine, and liquor license.
- 19 (b) (1) The Board may issue a Class B–D–7 license if the Board determines 20 that the license is reasonably necessary for the convenience of the public.
- 21 (2) In making the determination, the Board shall consider the number of 22 beer, wine, and liquor outlets in a given area and the number of days the outlets are open,

1 rather than the nature of the outlets.

- 2 (c) The license authorizes the license holder to sell beer, wine, and liquor at retail at the place described in the license, for on– and off–premises consumption.
- 4 (d) (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, the license 5 holder may sell beer, wine, and liquor during the hours and days set out under § 12–2004(c) 6 of this title.
- 7 (2) The hours of sale for a license holder in an area bounded by Liberty 8 Heights Avenue, Northern Parkway, Druid Park Drive, and Wabash Avenue are from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m.
- 10 (e) The Board shall adopt regulations to determine the manner of operation of a licensed premises.
- 12 (f) The annual license fee is \$1,320.
- 13 12–1705.
- 14 (a) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section, a transfer of a license shall 15 be completed on or before 180 days after the Board approves the transfer.
- 16 (b) (1) Within 180 days after the Board approves the transfer of a license, the 17 license holder or another appropriate interested party may make a written request to the 18 Board to extend the time authorized to complete the transfer due to hardship.
- 19 (2) The Board may grant the extension if the Board finds after a hearing 20 that an existing hardship caused the delay in transferring the license.
- 21 (3) An extension may not prolong the period authorized to complete the 22 transfer beyond 270 days after the Board approves the transfer.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, a Class B–D–7 beer, wine, and liquor license issued for a premises in the 2200 block of West North Avenue shall be considered to be unexpired until the end of July 1, 2019, for purposes of completing the transfer to another owner at the same location, notwithstanding § 12–1705 of the Alcoholic Beverages Article.
- SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three—fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is enacted.
