4 FOR the purpose of establishing a certain educational qualification for an applicant for a $\mathbf{5}$ physical therapist assistant license who was educated in limited physical therapy 6 outside of any state; altering certain educational qualifications for certain applicants 7 for physical therapy licenses or physical therapist assistant licenses who were educated in any state; making technical and conforming changes; and generally 8 9 relating to qualifications for physical therapy licenses and physical therapist 10 assistant licenses.

1 (a) If an applicant for a physical therapy license has been educated in physical 2 therapy in any state, the applicant shall have:

10 (2) Completed satisfactorily the clinical training EDUCATION required by 11 the physical therapy [curriculum] PROGRAM.

12 (b) If an applicant for a physical therapy license has been educated in physical 13 therapy outside of any state, the applicant shall have graduated from a physical therapy 14 program that in the year of graduation had educational requirements equivalent to a 15 degree in physical therapy from a United States program accredited by the Commission on 16 Accreditation [of] IN Physical Therapy Education.

18 (A) [To qualify] IF AN APPLICANT for a physical therapist assistant license HAS 19 BEEN EDUCATED IN LIMITED PHYSICAL THERAPY IN ANY STATE, [an] THE applicant 20 shall have:

21 (1) Graduated from a [curriculum for] physical therapist [assistants] 22 ASSISTANT PROGRAM that is [approved]:

- (I) **APPROVED** by the American Physical Therapy Association; **OR**

24(II)ACCREDITED BY THE COMMISSION ON ACCREDITATION IN25PHYSICAL THERAPY EDUCATION; and

26 (2) Completed satisfactorily the clinical training <u>EDUCATION</u> required by 27 the [curriculum for] physical therapist [assistants] ASSISTANT PROGRAM.

(B) IF AN APPLICANT FOR A PHYSICAL THERAPIST ASSISTANT LICENSE HAS
BEEN EDUCATED IN LIMITED PHYSICAL THERAPY OUTSIDE OF ANY STATE, THE
APPLICANT SHALL HAVE GRADUATED FROM A PHYSICAL THERAPIST ASSISTANT
PROGRAM THAT IN THE YEAR OF GRADUATION HAS EDUCATIONAL REQUIREMENTS
EQUIVALENT TO A DEGREE IN LIMITED PHYSICAL THERAPY FROM A PROGRAM IN
