1 AN ACT concerning

Natural Resources - Regulation and Use of Commercial Finfish Trotlines Repeal of Sunset <u>and License Establishment</u>

4 FOR the purpose of repealing the termination provision for certain provisions of law $\mathbf{5}$ governing the regulation and use of commercial finfish trotlines; establishing a 6 commercial blue and flathead catfish finfish trotline license; authorizing a licensee 7 to catch for sale blue and flathead catfish in certain waters of the State using a 8 certain finfish trotline; requiring a licensee to fish in accordance with certain 9 regulations; establishing the application process for the license; establishing that an applicant for the license does not need to hold a certain tidal fish license; establishing 10 the term of the license; establishing a certain annual fee for the license; prohibiting 11 12 a licensee from transferring the license; requiring a licensee to have the license in the licensee's possession at certain times; making conforming changes; providing for 13 the termination of certain provisions of this Act; and generally relating to the 14regulation and use of commercial finfish trotlines. 15

5 (2) For the purposes of this subsection, artificial lures or plugs with 6 multiple or gang hooks are considered 1 set of hooks.

8 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 9 1, 2016. [It shall remain effective for a period of 3 years and, at the end of June 30, 2019, 10 with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and 11 of no further force and effect.]

12 <u>SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED</u>, That the Laws of Maryland read 13 <u>as follows:</u>

Article - Natural Resources

15 <u>4–701.</u>

(a) Except as provided in [§ 4–701.1] §§ 4–701.1 AND 4–701.2 of this subtitle,
this section applies to any person who is required under this subtitle or Subtitle 2, 8, 9, or
10 of this title to be licensed to guide fishing parties or to catch, sell, buy, process, transport,
export, or otherwise deal in fish caught in tidal waters.

20 <u>(b)</u> <u>(1)</u> Except as provided in [§ 4–701.1] §§ 4–701.1 AND 4–701.2 of this 21 subtitle, the Department shall utilize a single, commercial license, to be known and 22 designated as a tidal fish license.

24(A)THERE IS A COMMERCIAL BLUE AND FLATHEAD CATFISH FINFISH25TROTLINE LICENSE.

26(B)(1)THE LICENSE AUTHORIZES THE HOLDER TO CATCH FOR SALE27BLUE AND FLATHEAD CATFISH IN THE TIDAL WATERS OF THE STATE USING A28FINFISH TROTLINE, AS DEFINED IN DEPARTMENT REGULATIONS.

29(2)A LICENSEE SHALL FISH IN ACCORDANCE WITH DEPARTMENT30REGULATIONS.

1 A PERSON WHO WISHES TO OBTAIN THE LICENSE SHALL COMPLETE AND $\mathbf{2}$ SUBMIT AN APPLICATION FOR THE LICENSE TO THE DEPARTMENT OR ANY PERSON 3 DESIGNATED BY THE DEPARTMENT.

4 **(D)** AN APPLICANT FOR THE LICENSE DOES NOT NEED TO HOLD A TIDAL $\mathbf{5}$ FISH LICENSE UNDER § 4–701 OF THIS SUBTITLE TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR THE LICENSE.

6 THE TERM OF THE LICENSE IS 1 YEAR FROM SEPTEMBER 1 THROUGH **(E)** 7 AUGUST 31 THE FOLLOWING YEAR.

8 **(F)** THE ANNUAL LICENSE FEE IS \$15.

9 (G) A LICENSEE MAY NOT TRANSFER A LICENSE ISSUED UNDER THIS 10 SECTION.

11 **(H)** A LICENSEE SHALL HAVE A COMMERCIAL BLUE AND FLATHEAD CATFISH 12FINFISH TROTLINE LICENSE IN THE LICENSEE'S POSSESSION WHEN THE LICENSEE 13 FISHES UNDER THE LICENSE.

14SECTION 2-3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 15June 1, 2019. Section 2 of this Act shall remain effective for a period of 3 years and 1 month 16and, at the end of June 30, 2022, Section 2 of this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect. 17
