1 AN ACT concerning

Health Care Practitioners – Medical Examinations on Anesthetized or Unconscious Patients

4 FOR the purpose of prohibiting health care practitioners and certain students and trainees $\mathbf{5}$ from performing certain examinations on a patient who is under anesthesia or 6 unconscious unless the health care practitioner, student, or trainee obtained 7 informed consent from the patient for the examination, the performance of the 8 examination is within the scope standard of care for the patient, or the patient is 9 unconscious and the examination is required for diagnostic or treatment purposes, 10 or an emergency exists, it is impractical to obtain the patient's consent, and the 11 examination is required for diagnostic or treatment purposes; authorizing certain 12health occupations boards to take certain actions against certain health care 13 practitioners under certain circumstances and in accordance with certain hearing 14 provisions; defining a certain term; and generally relating to medical examinations 15on anesthetized or unconscious patients.
