2	Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §15688-A, sub-§10 is enacted to read:		
3	10. Capital improvements and equipment purchases for career and technical		
4	education centers and regions. The commissioner may expend and disburse funds to		
5	career and technical education centers and career and technical education regions to make		
6	capital improvements and to purchase equipment that has a useful life of at least 5 years.

20	This bill authorizes the Commissioner of Education to expend and disburse funds to		
21	career and technical education centers and career and technical education regions to make		
22	capital improvements and to purchase equipment that has a useful life of at least 5 years		
23	and provides a one-time General Fund appropriation of \$4,000,000 in fiscal year 2020-21		
24	for that purpose.
