An Act Relating to Long-term Care Pharmacies

- 1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 2 **Sec. 1. 32 MRSA §13702-A, sub-§12-B** is enacted to read: 3 12-B. Enhanced pharmacy and clinical services. "Enhanced pharmacy and clinical services" means services defined by the board by rule, including but not limited to: 4 5 A. Dispensing of drugs pursuant to a prescription or chart order in specialized packaging, including unit-of-use packaging, unit-dose packaging, single-use 6 containers, packaging from remote automated dispensing technology or other required 7 8 packaging; 9 B. Comprehensive drug utilization review and appropriate clinical monitoring, 10 including monitoring to identify potential adverse drug reactions and inappropriate 11 drug usage; 12 C. Drug reconciliation services at the transition of care into and out of a long-term care 13 setting and other necessary clinical management and drug services; 14 D. Timely drug delivery 24 hours a day, 7 days a week; 15 E. Pharmacist on-call availability to provide dispensing and clinical services 24 hours 16 a day, 7 days a week; and 17 F. Providing of emergency supplies of drugs as permitted by law, including emergency 18 kits or remote automated dispensing technology. Sec. 2. 32 MRSA §13702-A, sub-§14-B is enacted to read: 19 14-B. Individuals who require enhanced drug services. "Individuals who require 20 21 enhanced drug services" means individuals who have one or more comorbid and medically 22 complex chronic conditions that are life-threatening or significantly limit overall health or 23 function, pose a high risk of hospitalization or other adverse health outcomes and require 24 enhanced pharmacy and clinical services. 25 Sec. 3. 32 MRSA §13702-A, sub-§15-A is enacted to read: 26 15-A. Long-term care pharmacy. "Long-term care pharmacy" means a pharmacy that is licensed to provide enhanced pharmacy and clinical services to individuals who 27 require enhanced drug services and reside in an intermediate care facility for persons with 28 29 intellectual disabilities as defined in Title 34-B, section 1001, subsection 4-B, a nursing facility as defined in Title 22, section 1812-A, a rehabilitation facility as defined in Title 30 22, section 328, subsection 25, an assisted housing program as defined in Title 22, section 31 32 7852, subsection 2 or an assisted living program as defined in Title 22, section 7852,

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The board consists of $7 \underline{8}$ members, two $\underline{2}$ of whom must be public members as defined in Title 5, section 12004-A and the remainder of whom must be licensed pharmacists who possess the qualifications specified in section 13713. At the time of the appointment, at least one of the licensed pharmacists must be a hospital pharmacist, at least one must be a

§13791. Return of drugs

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A drug or pharmaceutical preparation that has been dispensed on prescription may not be returned to pharmacy stock after being in possession and under the control of another person and if the drug or pharmaceutical preparation has been removed from the sealed manufacturer packaging. The drug or pharmaceutical preparation may be dispensed again only if the drug or preparation is packaged in an unbroken, sealed container or if, in the case of a hospital, a licensed pharmacist determines that the drug has not been impaired.

20 SUMMARY

> This bill creates a new category of pharmacy facility licensure for long-term care pharmacies. It defines terms regarding long-term care pharmacies for the Maine Pharmacy Act to mirror a proposed federal law. It increases the number of individuals on the Maine Board of Pharmacy from 7 to 8 members and requires that the additional member be a pharmacist working at a long-term care pharmacy at the time of appointment. It provides that a drug or pharmaceutical preparation may only be accepted back by a pharmacy to be dispensed again if the drug or preparation is packaged in an unbroken, sealed container.
