An Act to Improve Outcomes for Youth Transitioning from State Care by Reducing Barriers to Maintaining Health Care Coverage

1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §3174-G, sub-§1, ¶G-1, as amended by PL 2021, c. 519, §6, is

further amended by amending subparagraph (2) to read:

(2) A child under 21 years of age; and

Sec. 2. 22 MRSA §3174-G, sub-§1, ¶H, as enacted by IB 2017, c. 1, Pt. A, §3, is amended by amending the last blocked paragraph to read:

The department shall adopt rules, including emergency rules pursuant to Title 5, section 8054 if necessary, to implement this paragraph in a timely manner to ensure that the persons described in this paragraph are enrolled for and eligible to receive services no later than 180 days after the effective date of this paragraph. Rules adopted pursuant to this paragraph are routine technical rules as defined by Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A-; and

Sec. 3. 22 MRSA §3174-G, sub-§1, ¶I is enacted to read:

I. No later than July 1, 2024, a person 18 years of age or older and under 26 years of age who qualifies for medical assistance pursuant to 42 United States Code, Section 1396a(a)(10)(A)(i)(IX).

The department shall enroll a person eligible under this paragraph in the MaineCare program before the person attains 18 years of age or is emancipated from the foster care system. The department may not require a person eligible under this paragraph to submit eligibility information following the date of the person's initial enrollment in the MaineCare program or during the period the person is eligible under this paragraph.

Sec. 4. State plan amendment or waiver. No later than 90 days after the effective date of this Act, the Department of Health and Human Services shall submit a state plan amendment or waiver, as determined necessary by the department, to the United States Department of Health and Human Services, Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services.

26 SUMMARY

This bill requires the Department of Health and Human Services, no later than July 1, 2024, to enroll children who are in foster care in the MaineCare program and to maintain their enrollment until they reach 26 years of age. The bill requires that the department waive the annual eligibility determination for the MaineCare program during this period and requires that the department, no later than 90 days after the effective date of this legislation, submit a state plan amendment or waiver, as determined necessary by the department, to the United States Department of Health and Human Services, Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services.
