An Act to Align the Minimum Rate of Pay for Manufacturers of Maine License Plates at the Maine State Prison with Maine's Minimum Wage Laws

1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2 3	<b>Sec. 1. 29-A MRSA §451, sub-§6,</b> as amended by PL 1995, c. 645, Pt. C, §3, is further amended by amending the first blocked paragraph to read:
4 5 6 7	The Warden of the State Prison has charge of operations at the State Prison relative to the manufacture of all plates made for the State. The Warden of the State Prison, with the consent of the Secretary of State, may employ for limited periods of time a supervisor for the purpose of instructing immates residents in the operation of making such plates.
8 9	<b>Sec. 2. 29-A MRSA §451, sub-§6</b> , as amended by PL 1995, c. 645, Pt. C, §3, is further amended by enacting at the end a new last blocked paragraph to read:
10 11 12	The minimum hourly wage paid to residents manufacturing vehicle registration plates in accordance with this subsection is the minimum hourly wage set forth in Title 26, section 664, subsection 1.
13	SUMMARY
14 15 16 17	This bill provides that the minimum hourly wage for residents at the Maine State Prison working at tasks related to manufacturing vehicle registration plates must be consistent with Maine's minimum hourly wage. This bill also changes language in the current law referring to "inmate" to the wording "resident."
