1.7	(a) A person may not possess night vision or thermal imaging equipment while taking
1.8	wild animals or while having in possession, either individually or as one of a group of
1.9	persons, a firearm, bow, or other implement that could be used to take wild animals.
1.10	(b) This section does not apply to a firearm that is:
1.11	(1) unloaded;
1.12	(2) in a gun case expressly made to contain a firearm that fully encloses the firearm by
1.13	being zipped, snapped, buckled, tied, or otherwise fastened without any portion of the

1.15	(3) in the closed trunk of a motor vehicle.
