The governor's residence must be used for official ceremonial 1.7 functions of the state, and to provide suitable living quarters for the governor of the state. 1.8 The governor's residence and its infrastructure, including any publicly funded residence 1.9 established to provide temporary living quarters to the governor when the official residence 1.10 is unavailable, must not be used by the governor or any other public official for the purpose 1.11 of soliciting or receiving contributions on behalf of a campaign committee, political party 1.12 unit, or other entity subject to the jurisdiction of the Campaign Finance and Public Disclosure 1.13 Board. 1.14 **EFFECTIVE DATE.** This section is effective the day following final enactment.
