1.8	Sec. 17. No law shall embrace more than one subject, which shall be expressed in its
1.9	title. No law shall contain more than one policy topic within a single subject, unless the law
1.10	reflects the enactment of a major finance or revenue bill pursuant to the rules of each house.
1.11	A law enacting a major finance or revenue bill must not contain policy items with no fiscal
1.12	impact, a negligible fiscal impact, or which are not directly related to a fiscal item contained

1.14	Sec. 2. SUBMISSION TO VOTERS.
1.15	The proposed amendment must be submitted to the people at the 2018 general election.
